What have we learnt?

<u>Class R</u> In English this week we have been investigating an alien crash site in our forest area we have been writing reports and letters to the police to inform them. In Maths we have been working on money, recognising coins. In theme we have been creating our own planets using different media's.

<u>Class 1</u> In English this week we have been completing floorbook research for our new Theme - Butchers, Bakers, Candlestick Makers and writing some new year's resolutions. In Maths we have been learning about time in particular language to describe the times of the day, days of the week and months of the year. In Theme we have marked living memory onto a timeline and wrote some questions to ask Mrs Tamworth about life when she was 6 years old.

<u>Class 2</u> In English this week we started our new class book, Man on the Moon. We met Bob and had a look around his house! We have used apostrophes to label the things he owns.

In Maths we have been ordering numbers using place value, greater than, less than and equals signs. We also played a game outside in teams to challenge ourselves. We had to find numbers and order them quickly to try to win.

In Theme we have talked about what 'Living Memory' is. We found that asking older people what happened in the past can be a great resource to find out lots of interesting things.

Class 3 We have started our new book in English' Orion and the Dark'. We have looked at his fears and compared them to our own, listening to other people's opinions and trying to give solutions. We have considered how illustrations can have an effect on the reader and begun to look at speech. In maths we have been working on time. We enjoyed our active learning when we all drew a clock on the playground and became the minute hand, jumping round the clock. We have looked at roman numerals used on the clock and played activities with them; matching, ordering and using them in the clock position. In science, we have introduced our light topic and investigated how we can change the size and shape of a shadow by moving the object or the light source. Class 4 Happy new year to all of our Year 4 children and carers! We have started our new English book The Incredible Book Eating Boy this week and focussed on speech marks and inference. In science we looked at the three states of matter; solid, liquid and gas. And our weekly maths focus has been on Roman numerals. I am very impressed with the work we have done this week. 2019 has started well...keep it up! Class 5 This week in Class 5, we have started to read our new focus books in English called 'Wonder'. We have been introduced to the main character and learnt a little bit about him and why he is seen as being 'different.' In maths we have learnt about what happens when we go through zero-learning about negative numbers and when we may find negative numbers. We have also started to look at our new Theme for this half term 'The Diggle Great Escape' where we have drawn a bird's eye view of the school which we have then checked on Google Earth to see how accurate we were. Class 6 In English this week, Class 6 have started looking at a new book – Wonder. From this we have analysed characters and completed some research, which we will use next week to create a fact-file. In maths, we have been looking at co-ordinates across 4 quadrants. During this difficult week, Class 6 have shown incredible resilience and emotional maturity, and the support they have shown each other has been
